

Position: Assistant Professor of Counselor Education
Tenure Track, beginning Fall 2010

Duties: Teach Counselor Education courses in CACREP core areas and area of specialization; supervise practicum/internship students; participate in research and grant writing; engage in professional service; be involved in ACES, ACA, and other relevant professional organizations; serve on university committees; participate in community service; serve as CACREP liaison. Qualifications: Required: Doctorate in Counselor Education from a CACREP accredited program (by end of May 2010) OR a Doctorate in Counselor Education or a closely related field AND teaching experience in a CACREP accredited program; NCC credential or eligible; Louisiana LPC licensed or eligible; clear indication of experience and interest in participation in ACES and ACA.

Preferred: Experience with the preparation of a CACREP self-study; relevant experience in the profession; evidence of teaching effectiveness and clinical supervision; scholarly ability or evidence of potential for the development thereof.
